
## **Powering On/Off the Projector**

### **Powering On the Projector**

- **1.** Remove the lens cap.
- **2.** Ensure that the power cord and signal cable are securely connected. The Power LED will flash **green**.
- Turn on the lamp by pressing "Power/Standby" button on the control panel. ● And the Power LED will turn green. The first time you use the projector, you can select your prefered language from quick menu after the startup screen display.

- **4.** Turn on your source (computer, notebook, video player, etc.). The projector will detect your source automatically.
- If the screen displays "No Signal", please make sure the signal cables are securely connected.

 Turn on the projector first followed by the signal sources.

### **Powering Off the Projector**

1. Press the "Power/Standby" button to turn off the projector lamp, you will see a message "Power off the lamp? Picture Mute" displayed on the projector's screen. Press the "Power/Standby" button again to confirm, otherwise the message will disappear after 25 seconds.

Please note that if the key is pressed instead, the projector will enter the "Picture Mute" mode and no image will be displayed. To exit the "Picture Mute" mode, press the "Power/Standby" button again, or press "Hide" on the remote control.

2. The cooling fans continue to operate for about 60 seconds for cooling cycle and the Power LED will turn green. When the Power LED begins flashing, the projector has entered standby mode.



- **2.** Verify that your display resolution setting is less than or equal to 1280 x 1024.

For Windows 95, 98, 2000, XP:

- From the "My Computer" icon, open the "Control Panel" folder, and double click the "Display" icon.
- 2. Select the "Settings" tab
- 3. Click on the "Advanced Properties" button.

If the projector is still not displaying the entire image, you may need to change the monitor display that you are using. Refer to the following steps.

- **4.** Verify the resolution setting is less than or equal to 1280 x 1024 resolution.
- 5. Select the "Change" button under the "Monitor" tab.
- 6. Click on "Show all devices." Next, select "Standard monitor types" under the SP box; choose the resolution mode you need under the "Models" box.
- 7. Verify that the resolution setting of the monitor display is less than or equal to 1280 x 1024.
- ▶ If you are using a Notebook PC:
  - **1.** First, follow the steps above to adjust resolution of the computer.
  - **2.** Switch the Notebook PC display to the "external display only" or "CRT only" mode.
- If you experience difficulty changing resolutions or your monitor freezes, restart all equipment including the projector.

# Problem: The screen of the Notebook or PowerBook computer is not displaying a presentation.

If you are using a Notebook PC:

Some Notebook PCs may deactivate their own screens when a second display device is in use. Each has a different way to be reactivated. Refer to your computer's documentation for detailed information.

#### Problem: Image is unstable or flickering

- ▶ Use "Tracking" to correct it. See page 24 for more information.
- Change the monitor color setting or the frequency on your computer.

#### Problem: Image has vertical flickering bar

- Use "Frequency" to make an adjustment. See page 24 for more information.
- Check and reconfigure the display mode of your graphics card to ensure compatibility.

#### Problem: Image is out of focus

- Adjusts the Focus Ring on the projector lens. Refer to page 14.
- Make sure the projection screen is between the required distance 4.9 to 40.7 feet (1.5 to 12.5 meters) from the projector.

#### Problem: Image is reversed.

Press "Menu", then select "Management" to adjust the projection mode.

#### Problem: Lamp burns out or makes a popping sound

When the lamp reaches its end of life, it will burn out and may make a loud popping sound. If this happens, the projector will not turn back on until the lamp module has been replaced. To replace the lamp, follow the procedures in "Replacing the Lamp" page 35.


- "Lamp is approaching the end of its useful life in full power operation. Replacement Suggested!" will be shown about 10 seconds, when lamp is nearing end of life.
- "Projector Overheated. Lamp will automatically turn off soon." will be shown when the system temperature is too high.
- "Fan fail. Lamp will automatically turn off soon." will be shown when the fan is out of order.

## **Replacing the Lamp**

The projector will detect the lamp life itself. It will show you a warning message "Lamp may fail soon ! Replacement Suggested !" When you see this message, please contact your local reseller or service center.

Make sure the projector has cooled down for at least 30 minutes before replacing the lamp.






Warning: To reduce the risk of personal injury, avoid dropping the lamp module or touching the lamp bulb. If dropped, the bulb may shatter and cause injury.

- 6. Remove the 2 screws from the lamp module. ●
- 7. Pull out the lamp module.
- To replace the lamp module, reverse the previous steps.






