## TO THE OWNER

Before operating this projector, read this manual thoroughly and operate the projector properly.

This projector provides many convenient features and functions. Operating the projector properly enables you to manage those features and maintains it in better condition for a considerable time.

Improper operation may result in not only shortening the product-life, but also malfunctions, fire hazard, or other accidents.

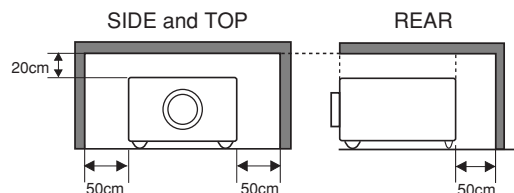
If your projector seems to operate improperly, read this manual again, check operations and cable connections and try the solutions in the "TROUBLESHOOTING" section at the end of this booklet. If the problem still persists, contact BOXLIGHT.



### SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

**WARNING : TO REDUCE THE RISK OF FIRE OR ELECTRIC SHOCK, DO NOT EXPOSE THIS APPLIANCE TO RAIN OR MOISTURE.**

- This projector produces intense light from the projection lens. Do not stare directly into the lens as it could possibly damage your eyes. Be especially careful that children do not stare directly into the beam.
- This projector should be installed as shown. If not, it may result in a fire hazard.
- Provide appropriate space on the top, sides and rear of the projector cabinet for allowing air circulation and cooling the projector. Minimum clearance must be maintained. If the projector is to be built into a compartment or similarly enclosed, the minimum distances must be maintained. Do not cover the ventilation slot on the projector. Heat build-up can reduce the service life of your projector, and can also be dangerous.
- Do not put any flammable object or spray can near the projector, hot air is exhausted from the ventilation holes.
- The Remote Control, supplied to this projector, emits the laser beam as the laser pointer function from Laser Light Window while pressing the LASER button (for 1 minute / LASER POINTER INDICATOR lights red to indicate laser emission). Do not look into the Laser Light Window or shine the laser beam on yourself or other people. Eye damage may result.
- If the projector is not to be used for an extended time, unplug the projector from the power outlet.

# SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

All the safety and operating instructions should be read before the product is operated.

Read all of the instructions given here and retain them for later use. Unplug this projector from AC power supply before cleaning. Do not use liquid or aerosol cleaners. Use a damp cloth for cleaning.

Follow all warnings and instructions marked on the projector.

For added protection to the projector during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet. This will prevent damage due to lightning and power line surges.

Do not expose this unit to rain or use near water... for example, in a wet basement, near a swimming pool, etc...

Do not use attachments not recommended by the manufacturer as they may cause hazards.

Do not place this projector on an unstable cart, stand, or table. The projector may fall, causing serious injury to a child or adult, and serious damage to the projector. Use only with a cart or stand recommended by the manufacturer, or sold with the projector. Wall or shelf mounting should follow the manufacturer's instructions, and should use a mounting kit approved by the manufacturers.

An appliance and cart combination should be moved with care. Quick stops, excessive force, and uneven surfaces may cause the appliance and cart combination to overturn.

Slots and openings in the back and bottom of the cabinet are provided for ventilation, to insure reliable operation of the equipment and to protect it from overheating.

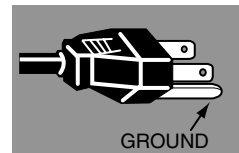

# FEATURES AND DESIGN

This Multimedia Projector is designed with the most advanced technology for portability, durability, and ease of use. This projector utilizes built-in multimedia features, a palette of 16.77 million colors, and matrix liquid crystal display (LCD) technology.

## ◆ Compact Design

---

This projector is extremely compact in size and weight. It is designed to be carried and work anywhere you wish to use.

## ◆ Short Zoom Lens

---

Short Zoom Lens allows you to enjoy a larger screen even in the limited space.

## ◆ Compatibility

---

This projector widely accepts various video and computer input signals including;

- **Computers**  
IBM-compatible or Macintosh computer up to 1280 x 1024 resolution.
- **6 Color Systems**  
NTSC, PAL, SECAM, NTSC 4.43, PAL-M or PAL-N color system can be connected.
- **Component Video**  
Component video signal, such as a DVD player output high definition TV signals including 480i, 480p, 575i, 575p, 720p, 1035i or 1080i, can be connected.
- **S-Video**  
S-Video signal, such as a S-VHS VCR output signal, can be connected.

## ◆ High Resolution Image

---

This projector provides 1024 x 768 dots resolution for computer input. Resolution from a computer between XGA (1024 x 768) and SXGA (1280 x 1024) is compressed into 1024 x 768 dots. This projector cannot display the image of over 1280 x 1024 dots. When the resolution of your computer is over than 1280 x 1024, reset the computer output for lower resolution.

## ◆ Multi-Scan System

---

This projector has Multi-Scan System to conform to almost all computer output signals quickly. There is no need for troublesome manual adjustment of frequency and other settings.

## ◆ One-Touch Auto PC Adjustment

---

Incoming computer video signals are recognized and the best adjustment is automatically set by Auto PC Adjustment. No complicated setup is necessary and projection is always precise.

## ◆ Digital Zoom (for Computer)

---

Digital Zoom function expands (to approx. 16 times of screen size) or compress the image size, allowing you to focus on crucial information at a presentation.

## ◆ Keystone Correction

---

This Power management function operates to turn the Projection lamp off when the projector detects signal interruption and any button is not pressed for over 5 minutes. The Projection lamp is automatically turned on again when the projector detects a signal or any operation button is pressed. This projector is shipped with this function ON.

This projector is equipped with DVI 29-pin terminal for connecting DVI output from a computer.

## ◆ Switchable Interface Terminal

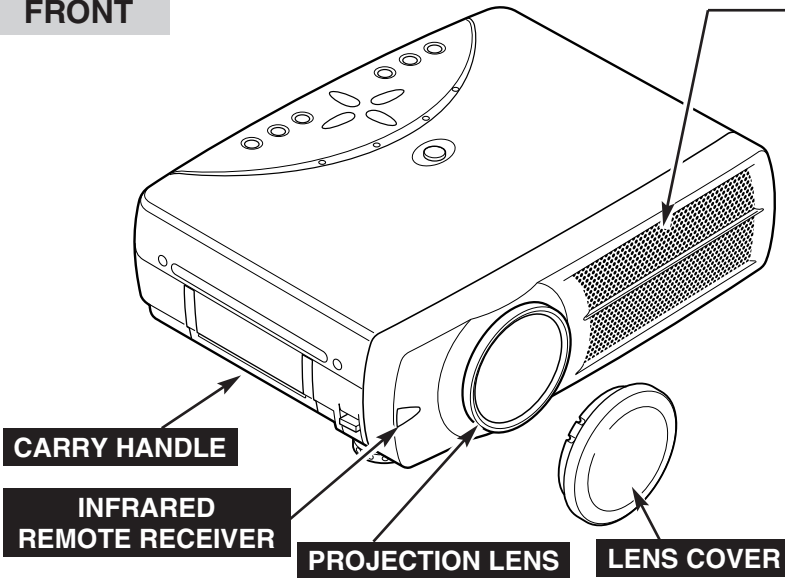

### EXHAUST VENTS

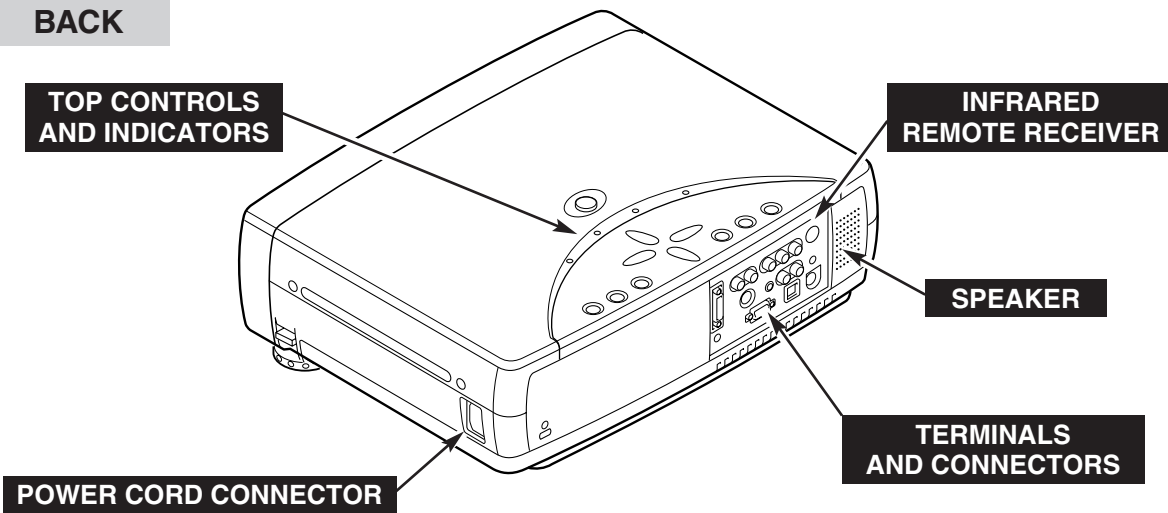


Hot air is exhausted from the exhaust vents. When using or installing the projector, the following precautions should be taken.

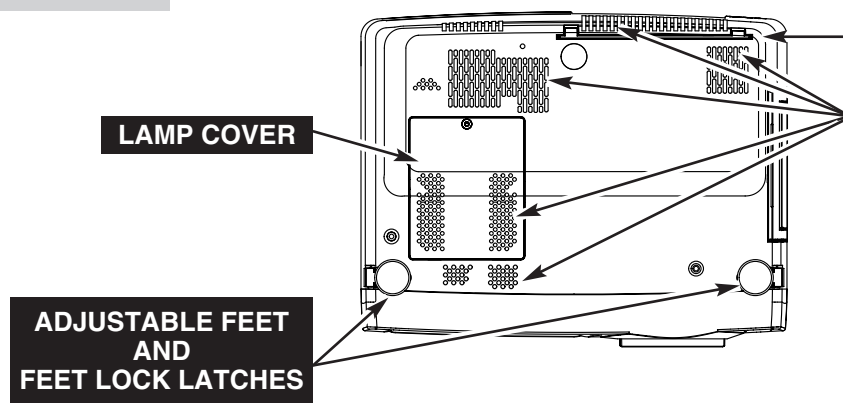
- Do not put any flammable objects near these vents.
- Keep front grills at least 3'(1m) away from any objects, especially heat-sensitive objects.
- Do not touch this area, especially screws and metallic part. This area will become hot while the projector is used.

This projector detects internal temperature and will automatically adjust the speed of the Cooling Fans.

### AIR INTAKE VENTS (Back and Bottom)

This projector is equipped with Cooling Fans for protection from overheating. Pay attention to the following to ensure proper ventilation and avoid a possible risk of fire and malfunction.

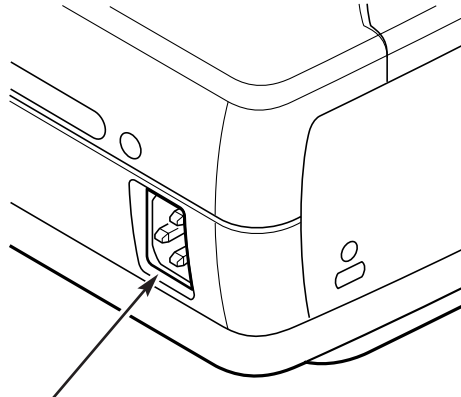

# SETTING-UP PROJECTOR

## CONNECTING AC POWER CORD

This projector uses nominal input voltages of 100-120 V or 200-240 V AC. This projector automatically selects the correct input voltage. It is designed to work with single-phase power systems having a grounded neutral conductor. To reduce risk of electrical shock, do not plug into any other type of power system. Consult your authorized dealer or service station if you are not sure of the type of power being supplied. Connect the projector with all peripheral equipment before turning the projector on. (Refer to pages 11 ~ 13 for connection.)



Connect AC Power Cord (supplied) to the projector. The AC outlet must be near this equipment and must be easily accessible.






### CAUTION

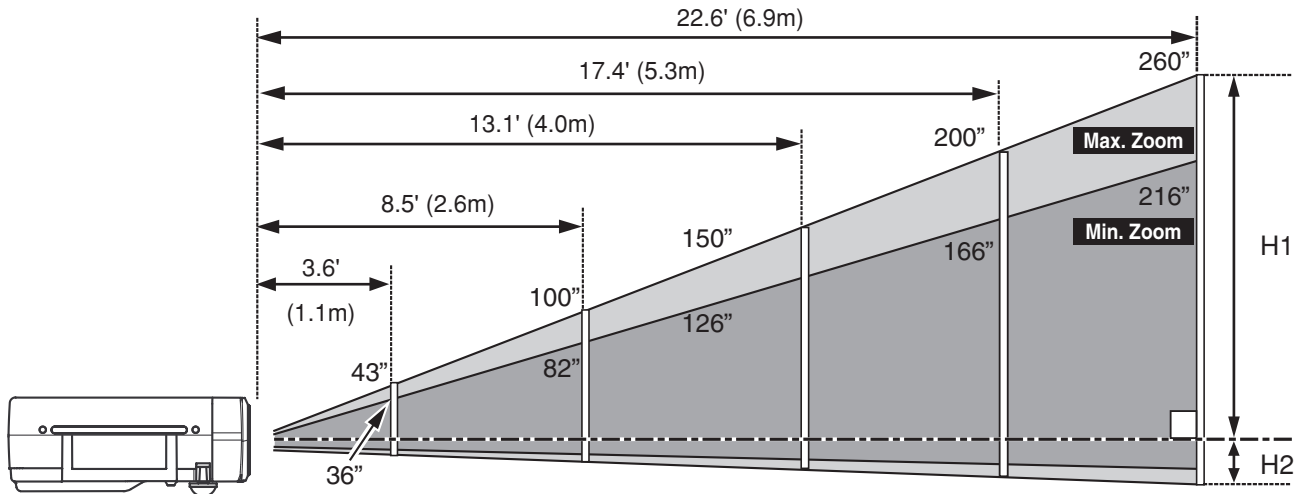
## POSITIONING PROJECTOR

- This projector is designed to project on a flat projection surface.
- The projector can be focused from 3.6'(1.1m) ~ 22.6'(6.9m).
- Refer to the figure below to adjust a screen size.

### ROOM LIGHT

The brightness in a room has a great influence on picture quality. It is recommended to limit ambient lighting in order to provide the best image.

## ADJUSTABLE FEET

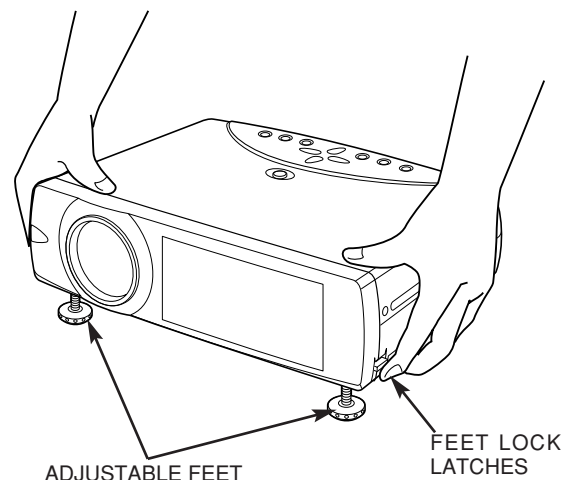
Picture tilt and projection angle can be adjusted by rotating ADJUSTABLE FEET. Projection angle can be adjusted up to 15.6 degrees.

- 1 Lift the front of the projector and pull the FEET LOCK LATCHES on both sides of the projector.
- 2 Release the FEET LOCK LATCHES to lock the ADJUSTABLE FEET and rotate the ADJUSTABLE FEET to adjust the position and tilt.
- 3 To retract the ADJUSTABLE FEET, lift the front of the projector and pull and undo the FEET LOCK LATCHES. Keystone distortion of the projected image can be adjusted by Menu Operation. (Refer to P20 and 36.)



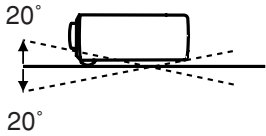
### CAUTION

Tilt the projector within the adjustable range in order not to shorten the life of the lamp. Proper angle should be taken. Refer to page 10.



## INSTALLING PROJECTOR IN PROPER POSITION

Install the projector properly. Improper installation may reduce the lamp lifetime and cause a fire hazard.



Do not tilt the projector more than 20 degrees above and below.



**NO UPWARD**

Do not point the projector up to project an image.



**NO DOWNWARD**

Do not point the projector down to project an image.



**NO SIDEWAYS**

Do not put the projector on either side to project an image.

## MOVING PROJECTOR

Use Carry Handle when moving a projector.

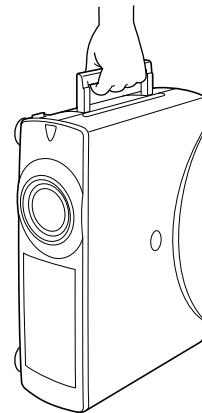
When moving the projector, replace the Lens Cover and retract the Adjustable Feet to prevent damage to the lens and cabinet.

When the projector is not in use for an extended period, put it into the case (carrying bag) supplied with the projector.



**CAUTION**

Carrying Bag (supplied) is intended for protection from dust and scratches on the surface of a cabinet, and it is not designed to protect an appliance from external forces. Do not transport the projector through a courier or transport services with this bag. The projector can be damaged. When handling the projector, do not drop, bump, subject it to strong forces or put other things on the cabinet.



### CAUTION IN CARRYING OR TRANSPORTING THE PROJECTOR

- Do not drop or bump the projector, otherwise damages or malfunctions may result.
- When carrying the projector, use a suitable carrying case.
- Do not transport the projector by using a courier or transport service in an unsuitable transport case. This may cause damage to the projector. To transport the projector through a courier or transport service, consult your Boxlight dealer for best way.

# CONNECTING PROJECTOR

## TERMINALS OF PROJECTOR

This projector has input and output terminals on its back for connecting computers and video equipment. Refer to figures on pages 11 to 13 and connect properly.

### S-VIDEO INPUT JACK

Connect the S-VIDEO output from video equipment to this jack. (Refer to P13.)

### AUDIO INPUT JACKS

Connect the audio output from video equipment to these jacks. (Refer to P13.)

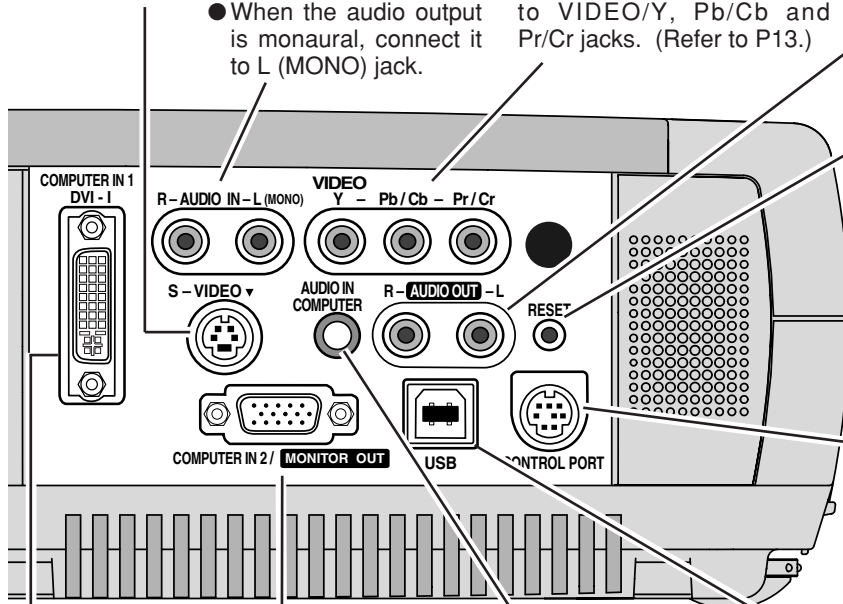
● When the audio output is monaural, connect it to L (MONO) jack.

### VIDEO INPUT JACKS

Connect the composite video output from video equipment to VIDEO/Y jack or connect the component video outputs to VIDEO/Y, Pb/Cb and Pr/Cr jacks. (Refer to P13.)

### AUDIO OUTPUT JACKS

Connect an external audio amplifier to these jacks. (Refer to P12, 13.)



### RESET BUTTON

This projector uses a micro processor to control this unit, and occasionally, this micro processor may malfunction and need to be reset. This can be done by pressing RESET button with a pen, which will shut down and restart the unit. Do not use RESET function excessively.

### CONTROL PORT CONNECTOR

When controlling the computer with Remote Control of this projector, connect the mouse port of your personal computer to this connector. (Refer to P12.)

### COMPUTER INPUT / MONITOR OUTPUT TERMINAL

This terminal is switchable and can be used as computer input or monitor output. Set the terminal up as either Computer input or Monitor output properly before using this terminal. (Refer to P12, 13, 36.)

Note: This terminal outputs analog signal from COMPUTER IN 1 DVI-I terminal only.

### COMPUTER INPUT (DIGITAL/ANALOG)

Connect computer output (Digital / Analog DVI-I type) to this terminal. (Refer to P12.)

### COMPUTER AUDIO INPUT JACK

Connect the audio output (stereo) from computer to this jack. (Refer to P12.)

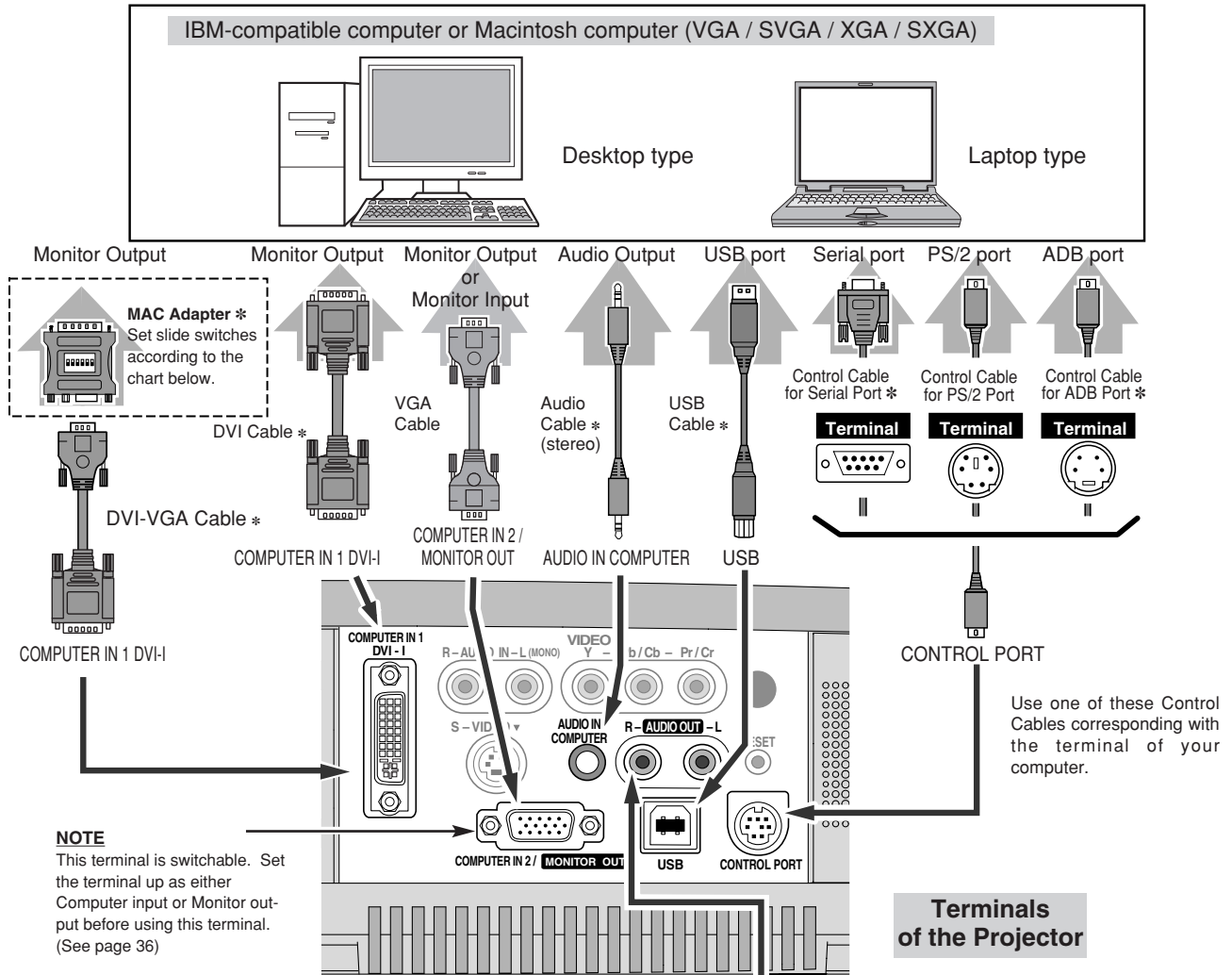
### USB CONNECTOR (Series B)

When controlling the computer with Remote Control of this projector, connect USB port of your personal computer to this connector. (Refer to P12.)

### Left Side



#### ALL-OFF SWITCH

When using the Remote Control, turn this switch to "ON." And turn it to "ALL OFF" when it is not used.

### DIP SWITCH IN THE BATTERY COMPARTMENT

The SW4 is used for laser pointer on/off switching. SW1-3 is used to change the Remote Control code. Set each switch as shown in the table below. Refer to the menu item "Remote control" in the SETTING Menu on page 37.

## Power management

This function turns the Projection Lamp off when this projector detects signal interruption and is not used for a certain period in order to reduce power consumption and maintain the Lamp-life. (This projector is shipped with this function ON.)

The Power Management function operates to turn the Projection Lamp off when the input signal is interrupted and any button is not pressed over 5 minutes. This function operates as follows;

1. When any input signal is interrupted, "No signal" and the counting down display appears (for 5 minutes).
2. After counting down for 5 minutes, the Projection Lamp and the READY Indicator are turned off. (Cooling Fans keep running.)
3. The READY Indicator starts to flash after cooling down the Projection Lamp about for 90 seconds (Power Management mode).


In this Power Management mode, the Projection Lamp is automatically turned on when the input signal is connected or the projector is operated with any button on the Top Control or on the Remote Control again.

## On start

When this function is "On," the projector is automatically turned on just by connecting the AC Power cord to a wall outlet.

Note ; Be sure to turn the projector off properly (refer to the section "TURNING OFF PROJECTOR" on page 19). If the projector is turned off in the wrong steps, the On Start function does not operate properly.

## Lamp mode

When selecting the "  " (Eco), the projector reduce the brightness and set into the low power consumption mode.

## Remote control

This projector has eight different remote control codes (Code 1-Code 8); the factory-set, initial code (Code 1) and the other seven codes (Code 2 to Code 8). This switching function prevents remote control operation mixture (jam) when operating several projectors or video equipment together.

For example operating the projector in "Code 7," both the projector and the Remote Control must be switched to "Code 7."

### **To change the code of the Projector:**

To change the remote control code of the projector used in ON-SCREEN MENU is selectable from Code 1 to Code 8.

### **To change the code of the Remote Control:**

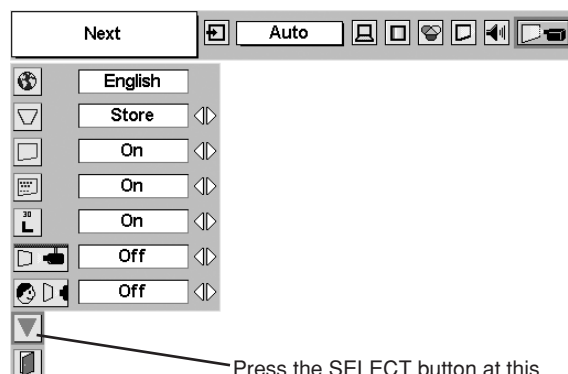

This indicator lights yellow when the life of the projection lamp draws to an end. Replace the Projection Lamp with a new one promptly.



Allow a projector to cool, for at least 45 minutes before you open Lamp Cover. The inside of a projector can become very hot.



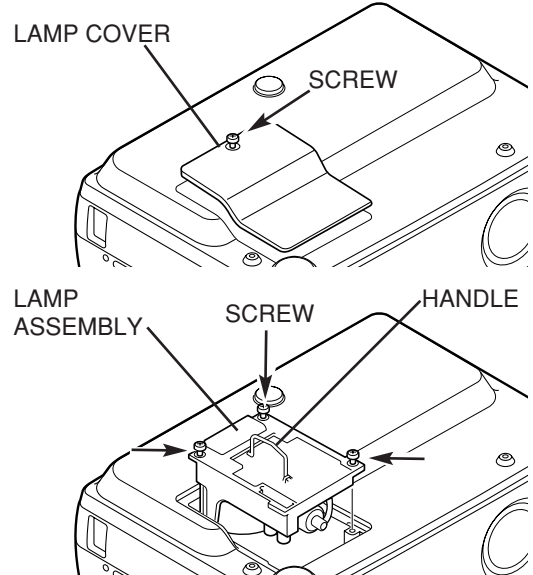
### CAUTION

For continued safety, replace with a lamp assembly of the same type.

Do not drop a lamp assembly or touch a glass bulb! The glass can shatter and may cause injury.

Follow these steps to replace the lamp assembly.

- 1** Turn off the projector and disconnect the AC plug. Allow the projector to cool for at least 45 minutes.
- 2** To remove the Lamp Cover, remove the screw with a screwdriver.
- 3** Loosen 3 screws with a screwdriver and pull out the Lamp Assembly by grasping the Handle.
- 4** Replace the Lamp Assembly with a new one and tighten the 3 screws back into position. Make sure that the Lamp Assembly is set properly. Replace the Lamp Cover and tighten the screw.
- 5** Connect the AC Power Cord to the projector and turn on the projector.
- 6** **Reset the Lamp Replace Counter.**

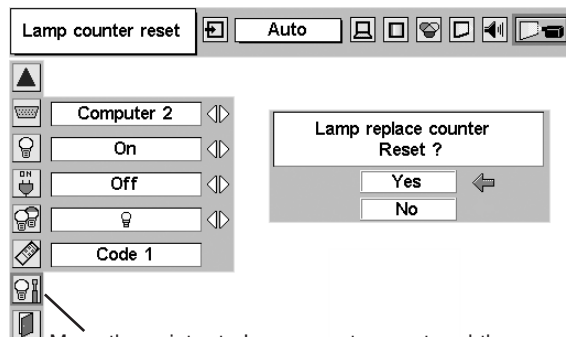

- 1 Turn the projector on, press the MENU button and the ON-SCREEN MENU will appear. Press the POINT LEFT/RIGHT button(s) to move the red frame pointer to the SETTING Menu icon (refer to page 36, 37).
- 2 Press the POINT DOWN button to move the red frame pointer to "Lamp counter reset" and then press the SELECT button. The message "Lamp replace counter reset?" is displayed. Move the pointer to [Yes] and then press the SELECT button.
- 3 Another confirmation dialog box appears and select [Yes] to reset the Lamp Replace Counter.

**NOTE : Do not reset the Lamp Replace Counter before the Projection Lamp is replaced.**



## LAMP HANDLING PRECAUTIONS

This projector uses a high-pressure lamp which must be handled carefully and properly. Improper handling may result in accidents, injury, or create a fire hazard.

- Lamp lifetime may differ from lamp to lamp and according to the environment of use. There is no guarantee of the same lifetime for each lamp. Some lamps may fail or terminate their lifetime in a shorter period of time than other similar lamps.
- If the projector indicates that the lamp should be replaced, i.e., if the LAMP REPLACE INDICATOR lights up, replace the lamp with a new one IMMEDIATELY after the projector has cooled down. ( Follow carefully the instructions in the LAMP REPLACEMENT section of this manual. ) Continuous use of the lamp with the LAMP REPLACE INDICATOR lighted may increase the risk of lamp explosion.
- A Lamp may explode as a result of vibration, shock or degradation as a result of hours of use as its lifetime draws to an end. Risk of explosion may differ according to the environment or conditions in which the projector and lamp are being used.

### IF A LAMP EXPLODES, THE FOLLOWING SAFETY PRECAUTIONS SHOULD BE TAKEN.

If a lamp explodes, disconnect the projector's AC plug from the AC outlet immediately. Contact an authorized service station for a checkup of the unit and replacement of the lamp. Additionally, check carefully to ensure that there are no broken shards or pieces of glass around the projector or coming out from the cooling air circulation holes. Any broken shards found should be cleaned up carefully. No one should check the inside of the projector except those who are authorized trained technicians and who are familiar with projector service. Inappropriate attempts to service the unit by anyone, especially those who are not appropriately trained to do so, may result in an accident or injury caused by pieces of broken glass.



## OPERATING WIRELESS MOUSE

The Remote Control is not only able to operate this projector but also usable as a wireless mouse for most Personal Computers. The POINT button, drag ON/OFF button and two CLICK buttons are used for wireless mouse operation. This Wireless Mouse function is available only when PC mouse pointer is displayed on a projected screen.

### INSTALLATION

To use the Remote Control as Wireless Mouse for a Personal Computer, installation of the mouse driver (not supplied) is required. Make sure that the mouse driver is properly installed in your computer. And make sure that the mouse port (or USB port) of a Personal Computer is activated.

- 1 Connect the mouse port (or USB port) of your computer to Control Port (or USB connector) of this projector with Control Cable (or USB cable). (Refer to page 11, 12 for connection.)
- 2 Turn the projector on first, and then turn on your computer. When the computer is switched on first, Wireless Mouse may not work properly.

Note : When your computer has no mouse port, connect Serial Port of your computer to Control Port of the projector with Control Cable for Serial Port (not supplied).

### OPERATING WIRELESS MOUSE

When controlling a PC mouse pointer, operate Wireless Mouse with POINT button, Drag ON/OFF button, LEFT CLICK button and RIGHT CLICK button on Wireless Remote Control.

#### POINT button

Used to move PC mouse pointer. The pointer is moved corresponding with the direction you are pressing.

#### LEFT CLICK button

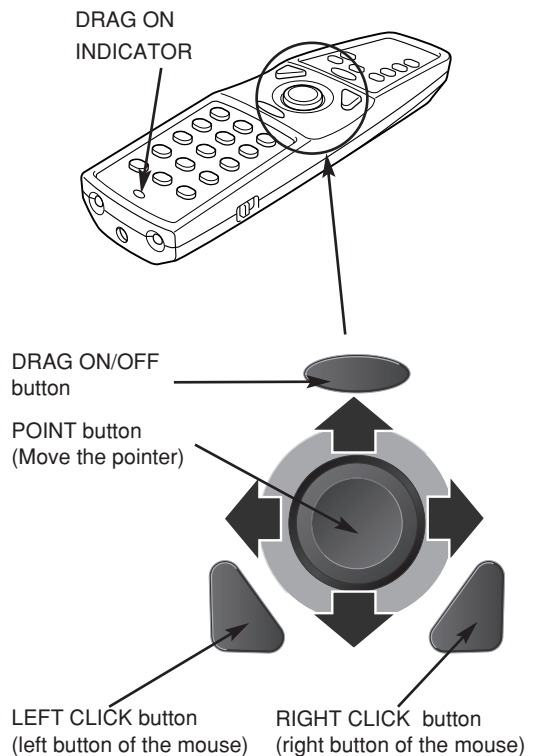
This button has the same function as the left button in a PC mouse. Press this button and the POINT button to drag a selected screen object.

#### RIGHT CLICK button

This button has the same function as the right button in a PC mouse.

#### DRAG ON/OFF button

Use this button and the POINT button to drag a selected screen object. Press and release the Drag ON/OFF button, DRAG ON INDICATOR lights green and the remote control is in Drag mode. Use the POINT button in the direction that you want to drag the screen object. Press and release the Drag ON/OFF button again or press any other button, to drop the object at the new screen location.



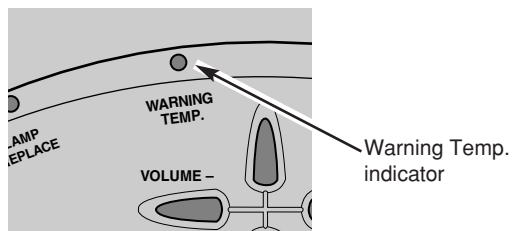
## MAINTENANCE

### WARNING TEMP. INDICATOR

The WARNING TEMP. indicator flashes red when an internal temperature of the projector exceeds the normal temperature. The projector cannot be turned on while the WARNING TEMP. indicator is flashing with the READY indicator off. When the temperature inside the projector returns to normal, the READY indicator lights green. Then you can turn the projector back on. The WARNING TEMP indicator stops flashing after turning the projector on. If the WARNING TEMP indicator continues to flash after turning the projector back on, check the items listed below.

- 1 Ventilation slots of the projector may be blocked. In such an event, reposition the projector so that the Ventilation slots cannot be obstructed.
- 2 The Air filter may be clogged with dust particles. Clean the Air filter by following the section "AIR FILTER CARE AND CLEANING" below.
- 3 If the WARNING TEMP. indicator remains on after performing the above checks, the Cooling fans or the internal circuits may be malfunctioning. In that case, call Boxlight at 1-800-762-5757 or 360-779-7901 for service.

### AIR FILTER CARE AND CLEANING

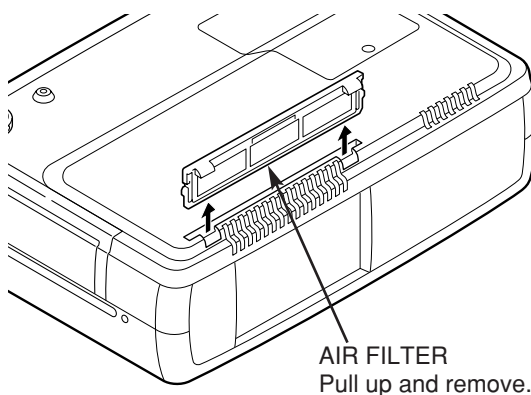
Removable Air Filter prevents dust from accumulating on the surface of the Projection Lens and Projection Mirror. Should the Air Filter become clogged with dust particles, it will reduce Cooling Fans' effectiveness and may result in internal heat build up and adversely affect the life of the projector. Clean the Air Filter following the steps below:

- 1 Turn off the projector, and disconnect AC power cord from the AC outlet.
- 2 Turn the projector upside down and remove the Air Filter by pulling the latches upward.
- 3 Clean the Air Filter with a brush or wash out dust and particles.
- 4 Replace the Air Filter properly. Make sure that the Air Filter is fully inserted.



#### CAUTION

Do not operate the projector with the Air Filter removed. Dust may accumulate on the LCD Panel and the Projection Mirror degrading picture quality. Do not put small parts into the Air Intake Vents. It may result in malfunction of the projector.



#### RECOMMENDATION

**We recommend avoiding dusty/smoky environments when operating a projector. Usage in these environments may cause poor image quality.**

When using under dusty or smoky conditions, dust may accumulate on a lens, liquid crystal panels, or optical elements inside the projector. This condition may degrade the quality of a projected image.

### CLEANING PROJECTION LENS

Follow these steps to clean the Projection Lens:

- 1 Apply a non-abrasive camera lens cleaner to a soft, dry cleaning cloth. Avoid using an excessive amount of cleaner. Abrasive cleaners, solvents or other harsh chemicals might scratch a surface.
- 2 Lightly wipe a cleaning cloth over the Projection Lens.
- 3 When the projector is not in use, replace the Lens Cover.

## TROUBLESHOOTING

Before calling your dealer or service center for assistance, check the items below once again.

- Make sure you have connected the projector to peripheral equipment as described properly in the section "CONNECTING PROJECTOR" on pages 11 ~ 13.
- Verify that all computer, video and power cord are properly connected and turn the equipment on.
- When you are operating the projector with a computer and it does not produce an image, restart the computer.
- Select the other input source.
