- ★ Warning- To reduce the risk of fire or electric shock, do not expose this product to rain or moisture.
- **↑ Warning-** Please do not open or disassemble the product as this may cause electric shock.
- **Warning-** When changing the lamp, please allow unit to cool down, and follow all changing instructions.
- **Warning-** This product will detect the life of the lamp itself. Please be sure to change the lamp when it shows warning messages.
- <u>∧</u> Warning- Reset the "Lamp Hour Reset" function from the On Screen Display "Management" menu after replacing the lamp module (refer to page 24).
- **Warning-** When switching the projector off, please ensure the projector completes its cooling cycle before disconnecting power.

- To ensure the projector works well with your computer, please set the display mode of your graphic card less than or equal to 1024 X 768 resolution. Make sure the timing of the display mode is compatible with the projector. Refer to the "Compatibility Modes" section on page 35.

### Powering On/Off the Projector

### **Powering On the Projector**

- **1.** Remove the lens cap.
- **2.** Ensure that the power cord and signal cable are securely connected. The Power LED will turn **red**.
- 3. Turn on the lamp by pressing "Power/Standby" button on the control panel.  $oldsymbol{0}$ 
  - The startup screen will display for 30 seconds and the Power LED will flash **green**.
  - When the startup screen disappears, the Power LED will turn **green**.
- **4.** Turn on your source (computer, notebook, video player, etc.). The projector will detect your source automatically.
- \* If the screen displays "No Signal", please make sure the signal cables are securely connected.
- \* If you connect multiple sources at the same time, using the "Source" button on the control panel to switch.





Turn on the projector first and then the signal sources.

#### **Powering Off the Projector**

- Press the "Power/Standby" button to turn off the projector lamp, you will see a message "Please press power button again to complete the shutdown process. Warning: DO NOT unplug while the projector fan is still running." on the on-screen display.
- **2.** Press the "Power/Standby" button again to confirm. Otherwise the message will disappear after **10** seconds.
- 3. The cooling fans continue to operate for about 120 seconds for cooling cycle and the Power LED will turn red. When the light stops flashing, the projector has entered standby mode. If you wish to turn the projector back on, you must wait until the projector has completed the cooling cycle and has entered standby mode. Once in standby mode, simply press "Power/Standby" button to restart the projector.
- **4.** Disconnect the power cord from the electrical outlet and the projector.
- Do not turn on the projector immediately following a power off procedure.

#### **Warning Indicator**

- When the "TEMP" indicator turns red, it indicates the projector has overheated. The projector will automatically shut itself down. See page 32.
- When the "LAMP" indicator flashes red (0.5 second intervals), it indicates a problem with the lamp. Turn off the projector and disconnect the power cord from the electrical outlet, then contact your local dealer or our service center. See page 32.
- When the "LAMP" indicator flashes red (1 second intervals), it indicates the fan failed. Stop using the projector and disconnect the power cord from the electrical outlet, then contact your local dealer or our service center. See page 32.



# Adjusting the Projected Image Adjusting the Projector Image Height

The projector is equipped with an elevator foot for adjusting the image height.

To raise the image:

- **1.** Press the elevator button **1**.
- 2. Raise the image to the desired height angle 2, then release the button to lock the elevator foot into position.
- **3.** Use **3** to fine-tune the display angle.

To lower the image:

- **1.** Press the elevator button.
- **2.** Lower the image, then release the button to lock the elevator foot into position.
- **3.** Use **3** to fine-tune the display angle.




#### Adjusting the Projector Zoom/Focus

You may turn the zoom ring to zoom in or out. To focus the image, rotate the focus ring until the image is clear. The projector will focus at distances from 3.9 to 39.4 feet (1.2 to 12.0 meters).

#### **Using the Control Panel**

#### Power/Standby

#### Source

Press "Source" to choose RGB, Component-p, Component-i, S-Video, Composite Video and HDTV sources.

#### Menu

Press "Menu" to launch the on screen display (OSD) menu. To exit OSD, press "Menu" again.

#### 

Adjusts image distortion caused by tilting the projector (±16 degrees).

#### Four Directional Select Keys

- ▶ Use ♠ ▼ ◆ b to select items or make adjustments to your selection.
- for Enter function to confirm your selection of items .

#### **Re-Sync** (Only Analog RGB signal valid)

▶ Automatically synchronizes the projector to the input source.

#### **Empowering Key**

### **User Controls**

#### Keystone

▶ Press "Keystone", then press to adjust vertical and horizontal image distortion by tilting the projector (±16 degrees).

#### Component

Press "Component" to change source to component connector. This connector supports YPbPr (480p/576p/720p/1080i) and YCbCr (480i/576i).

#### S-Video

▶ Press "S-Video" to change source to S-Video source.

#### **VGA**

Press "VGA" to change source to VGA-In connector. This connector supports Analog RGB, YPbPr (480p/576p/720p/1080i), YCbCr (480i/576i) and RGBsync.

#### DVI

Press "DVI" to change source to DVI connector. This connector supports Digital RGB, Analog RGB, YPbPr (480p/ 576p/720p/1080i), YCbCr (480i/576i) and HDCP signal.

#### Volume +/-

▶ Increase/decrease the volume.

#### Video

▶ Press "Video" to change source to Composite Video source.

### On Screen Display Menus

The Projector has multilingual On Screen Display menus that allow you to make image adjustments and change a variety of settings. The projector will automatically detect the source.

#### How to operate

- **1.** To open the OSD menu, press "Menu" on the Remote Control or Control Panel.
- 2. When OSD is displayed, use ♠ keys to select any item in the main menu. After selecting the desired main menu item, press ♠ to enter sub menu for feature setting.
- Use ♠ keys to select the desired item and adjust the settings by ♠ key.
- **4.** Select the next item to be adjusted in the sub menu and adjust as described above.
- **5.** Press "Menu" to confirm, and the screen will return to the main menu.
- **6.** To exit OSD, press "Menu" again. The OSD menu will close and the projector will automatically save the new settings.







Color

#### Display Mode

There are many factory presets optimized for various types of images.

- PC : For computer or notebook.
- ▶ Video : For playing video in a bright environment.
- ▶ Theatre : For Home Theatre usage in a dark room.
- User : Memorize user's settings.

#### **Brightness**

Adjust the brightness of the image.

- ▶ Press the ◀ to darken image.
- ▶ Press the ▶ to lighten the image.

#### Contrast

The contrast controls the degree of difference between the lightest and darkest parts of the picture. Adjusting the contrast changes the amount of black and white in the image.

- ▶ Press the ◀ to decrease the contrast.
- ▶ Press the (▶) to increase the contrast.

#### **Color Temperture**

Adjust the color temperature. At higher temperature, the screen looks colder; at lower temperature, the screen looks warmer.





#### Color

#### White Segment

Use the white Segment control to set the white peaking level of DMD chip. 0 stands for minimal segment, and 10 stands for maximum segment. If you prefer a stronger image, adjust towards the maximum setting. For a smooth and more natural image, adjust towards the minimum setting.

#### Degamma

Effects the represent of dark scenery. With greater gamma value, dark scenery will look brighter.

#### Color R

Adjusts the red color.

#### Color G

Adjusts the green color.

#### Color B

Adjusts the blue color.

#### Saturation

Adjusts a video image from black and white to fully saturated color.

- ▶ Press the (◀) to decrease the amount of color in the image.
- ▶ Press the (▶) to increase the amount of color in the image.

#### Tint

Adjusts the color balance of red and green.

- ▶ Press the (◀) to increase the amount of green in the image.
- Press the ( ) to increase the amount of red in the image.



"Saturation" and "Tint" functions are not supported under computer mode or DVI mode.

\*"Sharpness" functions is not supported under DVI mode.

#### Sharpness

Adjusts the sharpness of the image.

- ▶ Press the (◀) to decrease the sharpness.
- ▶ Press the (▶) to increase the sharpness.

#### V. Keystone

Press the  $\bigcirc$  or  $\bigcirc$  to adjust image distortion vertically and makes a squarer image.

#### H. Keystone

Press the  $\bigcirc$  or  $\bigcirc$  to adjust image distortion horizontally and makes a squarer image.

#### **Aspect Ratio**

Use this function to choose your desired aspect ratio.

- ▶ 4:3 : The input source will be scaled to fit the projection screen.
- ▶ 16:9 : The input source will be scaled to fit the width of the screen.
- Auto: Keep the image with original width-high ratio and maximize the image to fit native horizontal or vertical pixels.

#### 16:9 Image Position

Adjust the image position to up or down, when you select the aspect ratio to 16:9.

- ▶ Press the (◀) to move the image down.
- ▶ Press the (▶) to move the image up.





### **Image**

#### **H.Position (Horizontal Position)**

- ▶ Press the (◀) to move the image left.
- ▶ Press the (▶) to move the image right.

#### V. Position (Vertical Position)

- ▶ Press the (◀) to move the image down.
- ▶ Press the (▶) to move the image up.

#### Frequency

"Frequency" changes the display data frequency to match the frequency of your computer's graphic card. If you experience a vertical flickering bar, use this function to make an adjustment.

#### **Tracking**

"Tracking" synchronizes the signal timing of the display with the graphic card. If you experience an unstable or flickering image, use this function to correct it.





### Management

#### **ECO Mode**

Choose "On" to dim the projector lamp which will lower power consumption, extend the lamp life and reduce noise. Choose "Off" to return normal mode.

#### Menu Location

Choose the Menu location on the display screen.

#### **Projection**

#### Front-Desktop

The factory default setting.

Rear-Desktop

When you select this function, the projector reverses the image so you can project behind a translucent screen.

Front-Ceiling

When you select this function, the projector turns the image upside down for ceiling-mounted projection.

Rear-Ceiling

When you select this function, the projector reverses and turns the image upside down at same time. You can project from behind a translucent screen with ceiling mounted projection.





### Management

#### Source Lock

When source lock is turned off, the projector will search for other signals if the current input signal is lost. When source lock is turned on, it will "Lock" the current source channel before you press "Source" button on remote control for next channel.

#### Lamp Hour Elapse

Displays the lamp's elapsed operating time (in hours).

#### Lamp Hour Reset



Press the **()** button then choose "Yes "to turn the lamp hour counter to 0 hours.

#### Lamp Reminding

Choose this function to show or to hide warning message when the changing lamp message is displayed. The message will show up 30 hours before end of life.

#### Start-up screen

Choose "Acer" or "User to change the start-up screen to be acer default or user customized.

#### Capture User Image

Press the button then choose "Yes" to capture current displayed image for the "User" start-up screen.



#### Reset

Press the button then choose "Yes" to return the display parameters on all menus to the factory default settings.





### Audio

#### Volume

- ▶ Press the ◀ to decrease the volume.
- ▶ Press the (▶) to increase the volume.

#### Mute

- ▶ Choose the "On" to turn mute on.
- ▶ Choose the "Off" to turn mute off.





#### **Personals**

Edits user preferences by OSD interface. Edited user Info will display on lower left corner of the screen when projector is powered ON.

- 1.>Use the ( ) v to select "Line1" function, and then press the "Enter" button. You can input the character to line one.
- 2.>Use the ( ) to select character, and then press "Enter" to confirm your selection.
- 3.>Use the ♠ ♥ to select "Line2" function, and then press the "Enter" button. You can input the character to line two.
- 4.>Procedure as Step. 3.>
- 5.>Use the ▲ ▼ to select "Save & Exit" function and then press the "Enter" button.
- 6.>The startup screen will display the new wording after restart the projector.

- ▶ Each line can input 35 characters only.
- Use "Del" to delete the previous character.

# **Appendices**

### **Troubleshooting**

If you experience trouble with the projector, refer to the following information. If the problem persists, please contact your local reseller or service center.

#### Problem: No image appears on screen.

- Ensure all the cables and power connections are correctly and securely connected as described in the "Installation" section.
- Ensure the pins of connectors are not crooked or broken.
- Check if the projection lamp has been securely installed. Please refer to the "Replacing the lamp" section.
- Make sure you have removed the lens cap and the projector is switched on.
- Press A/V Mute button to maker sure the image has not been turned off temporarily.

#### Problem: Partial, scrolling or incorrectly displayed image.

- Press the "Sync" button on the Remote Control or Press the "Re-Sync" button on the Control Panel.
- If you use a PC:
   If the resolution of your computer is higher than 1024 x 768.
   Follow the steps outlined below to reset the resolution.

#### For Windows 3.x:

- **1.** In the Windows Program Manager, click the "Windows Setup" icon in the Main group.
- 2. Verify that your display resolution setting is less than or equal to  $1024 \times 768$ .

For Windows 95, 98, 2000, XP:

- **1.** Open "My Computer" icon, the "Control Panel" folder, and then double click on the "Display" icon.
- **2.** Select the "Setting" tab.
- **3.** In the "Desktop Area" you will find the resolution setting. Verify that the resolution setting is less than or equal to 1024 x 768 resolution.

If the projector is still not projecting the whole image, you will also need to change the monitor display you are using. Refer to the following steps.

Follow the above steps 1-2. Click on the "Advanced Proper ties" button.



- 5. Select the "Change" button under the "Monitor" tab.
- 6. Click on "Show all devices". Then select "Standard monitor types" under the "Manufacturers" box; choose the resolution mode you need under the "Models" box.
- 7. Verify that the resolution setting of the monitor display is less than or equal to  $1024 \times 768$ .
- If you are using a Notebook PC:
  - You are required to implement the above steps of resolution setting of the computer first.
  - **2.** Switch the Notebook PC display to the "external display only" or "CRT only" mode.
- If you experience difficulty in changing resolutions or your monitor freezes, restart all the equipment and the projector.

# Problem: The screen of the Notebook or PowerBook computer is not displaying your presentation.

- ▶ If you are using a Notebook PC:
  - Some Notebook PCs may deactivate their screens when a second display device is in use. Refer to your computer's documentation for information on how to reactivate the monitor display.
- If you are using an Apple PowerBook: In Control Panels, open the PowerBook Display to select Video Mirroring "On".

#### Problem: Image is unstable or flickering

- Use "Tracking" to correct it. Refer to page 22.
- ▶ Change the monitor color setting from your computer.

#### Problem: Image has vertical flickering bar

- ▶ Use "Frequency" to make an adjustment. Refer to page 22.
- ▶ Check and reconfigure the display mode of your graphic card to make it compatible with the product. Refer to page 29.

#### Problem: Image is out of focus

- Adjusts the Focus Ring on the projector lens. Refer to page 14.
- Make sure the projection screen is between the required distance 3.9 to 39.4 feet (1.2 to 12.0 meters) from the projector.



Problem: The image is outstretched when displaying 16:9 DVD.

The projector automatically detects 16:9 DVD and adjusts the aspect ratio by digitizing to full screen with 4:3 default setting.

If the image is still outstretched, you will also need to adjust the aspect ratio by referring to the following:

- Please select 4:3 aspect ratio type on your DVD player if you are playing a 16:9 DVD.
- ▶ If you can't select 4:3 aspect ratio type on your DVD player, please select 4:3 aspect ratio in the on screen menu.

#### Problem: Image is reversed.

▶ Select "Management" from the OSD and adjust the projection direction. See page 23.

#### Problem: Lamp burns out or makes a popping sound

When the lamp reaches its end of life, it will burn out and may make a loud popping sound. If this happens, the projector will not turn on until the lamp module has been replaced. To replace the lamp, follow the procedures in the "Replacing the Lamp". See page 33.

#### **Problem: Message Reminders**

- ▶ "Lamp is approaching the end of its useful life in full power operation. Replacement Suggested!" will be shown about 10 seconds when lamp life is going to deplete.
- ▶ "Projector Overheated. Lamp will automatically turn off soon." will be shown when the system temperature is over heat.
- "Fan fail. Lamp will automatically turn off soon." will be shown when the fan is out of order.




### Replacing the lamp

The projector will detect the lamp life itself. It will show you a warning message "Lamp life exceed" When you see this message, changing the lamp as soon as possible.

Make sure the projector has been cooled down for at least 30 minutes before changing the lamp.
